- Start a new high school girls' team and become a Girls' Team Startup Project team. Apply [here](#).
 - Applications are due January 15, although we are open to applications later in the year for fall state championships.
 - The GTSP provides support for up to three years to help teams develop to be competitive and self-sustaining.
- Apply for the YCC U20 Girls' Developmental Scholarship
 - We will be supporting the event fees for 10 players on three new teams.

- Sign up to host a Learn to Play clinic or league here, usultimate.org/learntoplay and Girls' Ultimate Movement (GUM) clinic or league, gum.usultimate.org. Check out [this link](#) for organizer responsibilities and what we offer.
 - For every clinic, we send a basic flyer, stickers, handouts, and a Five Ultimate dri-fit t-shirt for the organizer.
 - All youth clinic participants receive a free one-day event membership and benefit from USA Ultimate's insurance.
 - All GUM clinics and leagues receive a GUM banner, and most GUM events receive GUM headbands.
 - We can cover two volunteer's background check and SafeSport training. Ask Sarah for details!
 - We can setup a Google form for registration, so participants can easily complete the waiver.
 - If you would like additional support, such as a Learn to Play/GUM kit or marketing and operating budget (\$300 for clinics and higher amount for leagues) and equipment, please contact Sarah Powers, sarah@hq.usultimate.org.
- Run the middle school GUM curriculum, gum.usultimate.org/ms-curriculum/
 - This could be done as the affiliate or with a youth-serving organization, such as a JCC, Girl Scouts or YMCA.
- Apply for a free Learn to Play or GUM kit that includes equipment and resources to introduce new groups to ultimate.

- Facilitate a Coaching Development Program (CDP) workshop, usultimate.org/cdp.
 - Contact Dan Raabe to ensure you have a trainer in your area, and apply to run a clinic with him, dan@hq.usultimate.org
 - Workshop is 3 hours and 15 minutes, and registrant cost is \$35.
- Facilitate an Observer Certification Program (OCP) clinic, usultimate.org/ocp
 - Certification costs \$25, but that fee is refundable after working five games post clinic.
 - Clinics will be organized in conjunction with ultimate events and taught by USA Ultimate Observer Program trainers.

- Host an in-service for teachers, parents or youth-serving organization leaders to instruct them on how to teach ultimate.
 - It is now common for schools to run ultimate, but an in-service from experienced players or coaches would ensure that educators are teaching the sport correctly.
 - USA Ultimate provides the in-service plan, a free kit, stipend and t-shirt.

- Represent USA Ultimate and your local disc organization at your state's Physical Education conference.
 - Generate interest in the sport of ultimate and promote local playing opportunities.
